Worldview &#127822; Entertainment signed with Creative Artists Agency (CAA) in 2010 and has since become the agency&#39;s top film finance and production &#127822; client. Sarah E. Johnson, daughter of Franklin Resources Chairman, Charles B. Johnson, became a partner and investor in the company &#127822; in 2011. Worldview established a four-yearR\$30 million credit facility with Comerica in 2013 to provide debt financing for the company&#39;s &#127822; films, which coincided with the infusion ofR\$40 million in new equity from existing investors.
