No final dos anos 90, a Bundesliga introduziu a regra 50+1, que exige que os clubes de futebol alemães sejam 75% propriedade de seus membros, o que garante que os fãs tenham uma participação ativa na tomada de decisões do clube. Isso explica por que as decisões e salários estão sob controle e por que os preços dos ingressos ainda são relativamente baratos. A regra 50+1 compara o a outros grandes campeonatos europeus.

A adaptação das mudanças pelos clubes foi desigual, com a propriedade 75% da torcida assumindo diferentes formas.
